

DESCRIPTION

The Bachelor of Commerce in Law degree will equip you with conceptual understanding, knowledge, theory, skills, methodology and capacity to function effectively in the business and legal environment of the future.

You will gain advanced management knowledge and skills and will be able to make ethical decisions in a rapidly changing business environment driven by technological advances as well as advanced knowledge of the general rules of law in order to pursue a career in law or commerce.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- A Senior Certificate (SC) with degree endorsement; **OR**
- A National Senior Certificate (NSC) with a minimum of 40% in English Home Language or First Additional Language coupled with a minimum of 50% in four 20-credit modules; **OR**
- A National Senior Certificate - vocational level 4 (NC(V)) with a minimum of 60% in three fundamental modules including English, and minimum 70% in four vocational modules; **OR**
- The STADIO Higher Certificate in Paralegal Studies or Management (NQF 5); or the STADIO Diploma in Management (NQF 6); or a Higher Certificate (NQF 5), Advanced Certificate (NQF 6) or Diploma (NQF 6) in the field of:
 - Law; or
 - Management; or
 - Commerce. **OR**
- A cognate Higher Certificate (NQF Level 5), Advanced Certificate (NQF Level 6), or Diploma (NQF Level 6); **OR**
- A non-cognate Higher Certificate (NQF Level 5), Advanced Certificate (NQF Level 6), or Diploma (NQF Level 6), together with either:
 - a minimum of 40% in English Home Language or 30% in English First Additional Language at NSC level; or
 - evidence of equivalent proficiency in English achieved in the non-cognate programme.
