The Bachelor of Policing Practices Honours qualification aims at improving performance excellence and enhancing relationships with both internal and external clients of the law enforcement environment.

This Bachelor of Policing Practices Honours degree reflects the workplace-based needs within the policing and law enforcement sector that relate to managerial competencies.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- a STADIO Bachelor of Policing Practice degree (NQF7); **OR**
- another approved (NQF 7) degree.
- Bridging modules - In the event of an applicant not complying with the minimum admission requirements, he/she must complete the following bridging modules prior to commencing with the qualification.

POLICING ELECTIVE
