MODE OF DELIVERY

STADIO's distance learning programmes offer students excellent, quality education, without the need to attend venue-based classes. On registration, distance-learning students receive access to STADIO's state-of-the-art virtual learning environment. On this platform, the student has access to all learning materials, including a detailed plan for the semester/year, indicating all the learning and assessment activities. Throughout the learning journey, academic support is only a click away. Questions related to the study material may be asked in the online classroom environment where the lecturer will provide guidance. Distance-learning students will have the opportunity to meet and engage with guest lecturers who are experts from industries related to their field of study during special online lectures. All distance-learning students will complete some tasks in groups, where they will experience a safe environment to hone their leadership, collaboration, and interpersonal skills.

DESCRIPTION

The Diploma in Policing is aimed at students who are pursuing management careers within the field of Safety in Society. The level of flexibility within the range of electives will allow the individual to pursue further specialisation in the field of Safety in Society.

It reflects the need and demand within the policing environment for officials who are or will be performing managerial and leadership functions and demand more in-depth managerial knowledge and skills of organisational processes and procedures contextualised within the Safety in Society environment.

Successful completion provides access to the Bachelor of Policing Practice degree.

OUTCOMES

On achieving this qualification, the qualifying students will be able to:

1. Explain the concept of 'professional conduct' when rendering a public service.
2. Elaborate on the application of management principles in a policing environment.
3. Assess the requirements to uphold, enforce and the application of legal prescripts to a police situation in South Africa. Apply general administration functions to the field of policing.
4. Describe crime prevention as an integrated process involving stakeholders.
5. Suggest investigative principles applicable to a criminal investigation in a case study.
6. Discuss the integrated Criminal Justice System (CJS) as well as suggest effective communication methods about the policing environment.
7. Assess the utilisation of information and operational systems in a policing context related to the creation of a safe and secure environment.
8. Evaluate the exposition of the principles of criminology related to policing functions and the operational purposes to protect and serve the community.
9. Assess functional policing aspects to policing in a case study and analyse the application of resource management related to policing functions.
10. Elaborate on the concept of futuristic policing and lastly, discuss the management principles appropriate to a Community Service Centre according to SAPS Policies and Procedures.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- a Senior Certificate (SC); or
- a National Senior Certificate (NSC) with a minimum of 40% in four 20-credit modules, including English Home Language or First Additional Language; or
- a National Senior Certificate – Vocational Level 4 (NC(V)) with a minimum of 50% in three fundamental subjects, including English; and a minimum of 60% in three vocational subjects; or
- a Higher Certificate (NQF 5) or Advanced Certificate (NQF 6) in a cognate field.; or
- the STADIO, formerly Southern Business School (SBS) Higher Certificate in Management (NQF 5)
