DESCRIPTION

By studying towards the STADIO Higher Certificate in Photography, students will gain knowledge and skills to perform effectively in the industry as proficient photographers. This qualification will assist you with acquiring the technical and visual skills that align with current trends and practices within the digital working environment. The programme inducts students to the actual mechanics of photography, imaging, and studio practices.



MODE OF DELIVERY - CONTACT LEARNING (BLENDED CONTACT)

The programme is offered in STADIO's Blended Contact mode of delivery. Contact learning is aimed at students who want to attend venue-based face-to-face classes at one of STADIO's campuses. The Blended Contact mode combines classroom and online learning and teaching in a manner that includes some flexibility, while optimising the time students spend on campus. Based on the nature of the module, each module utilises a unique combination of the following learning settings:

- Classroom: Classroom sessions involve learning by doing, debating, arguing, trying, experimenting, practising, analysing, and sharing — all the skills students will need when they enter the world of work. Students will have the opportunity to contribute to the learning process and at the same time they will learn from the contributions of their fellow students. Class attendance of venue-based sessions is compulsory.
- Synchronous online: These are live online teaching sessions facilitated by a range of lecturers from different campuses. STADIO believes in encouraging students to think and engage laterally and to consider different perspectives and this is what students will get from having different experts share their knowledge with them. Students will be advised of the date and time of the session at the start of the semester, and they may connect from the comfort of their home, or from any other venue. They may also come to campus to make use of the campus Wi-Fi to join these sessions. Some of the live online sessions may be recorded, while others will not. It depends on the nature of the session and the lecturer will advise students beforehand. The lecturer will also use these sessions for group work and for discussions. These sessions are also compulsory, as they are an integral part of the teaching programme.
- · Asynchronous online: These are recorded lectures which students will watch in their own time, but within the timelines provided in the course environment. In these short sessions, the lecturers will explain the theoretical concepts and they will work through examples, etc. Students enjoy the benefit of watching these important sessions repeatedly during the semester, as they prepare for their assessments.

Students will find a detailed timetable indicating the combination of sessions on the learning management system (Canvas) at the start of the semester. This will enable them to plan their schedule ahead of time, and to optimise travelling arrangements to and from the campus.

Contact learning is suited to students who are able to attend and are interested in participating in face-to-face classes on a physical campus and who want to become part of a campus community with all the activities that go with being on the campus. It is important to realise that class attendance is compulsory and students must commit to regularly attend classes on campus if they want to be successful and derive the best benefits of contact learning.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The admission criteria for the Higher Certificate in

Photography are:

- Minimum admission requirement is a National Senior Certificate (NSC) with a minimum of 30% for English as a first or additional language
- Pre-2008, a Senior Certificate (SC) with a minimum of English: 40% (Home Language) or 34% (First Additional
- National Senior Certificate (Vocational) with a minimum of 30% for English as a first or second language and no additional specified subjects prescribed at the further education exit level
- Please note that no portfolio is required for the application process.



ARTICULATION POSSIBILITIES

After completion of the Higher Certificate in Photography (NQF 5), the student may articulate to the Bachelor of Arts in Fashion (Media Specialisation) (NQF 7) the Bachelor of Arts in Visual Arts in Visual Communication Design (NQF 7) or the Bachelor of Applied Arts in 3D Animation (NQF 7).

MODULE DESCRIPTIONS

APPLIED PHOTOGRAPHY

This module will equip students with the knowledge and skills to plan and produce photographic images in various locations. Students will also process photographic materials correctly through the computer workstation (digital editing of photos). Students will also be able to operate effectively within a photographic studio environment, utilising available light and artificial lighting equipment. This module will allow students to select appropriate photographic techniques, equipment and materials to produce desired photographic imagery. Skills will include operating their cameras in an creative manner, such as camera controls and composition. The genres covered throughout the year include portrait, wedding, food, architecture, beauty and fashion photography. By engaging with these different genres students will become technically grounded in the discipline of digital photography. Towards the end of their studies, students will create a specialised portfolio and website to be ready for industry.

IMAGE CREATION, COMPOSITION AND ENHANCEMENT

This module is designed to develop essential skills in digital imaging using computer manipulation and photographic software. The module provides students with image editing experience and provides the students with knowledge of the different software functions and a range of imaging and editing tools. These tools are specifically used for creating, manipulating and retouching photographs.

VISUAL COMMUNICATION

This module aims to support the students in classifying the individual and combinations of visual components to create meaning. Understanding these visual cues will assist photographers in consciously applying visual literacy to imagery to create meaning for the visual audience. Visual literacy will also assist students in planning the image composition and framing, ensuring that the visual language is explicit and visually appealing to a target audience.

VIDEOGRAPHY FOR SOCIAL MEDIA

This module aims to induct students to the basic principles of video filming and editing for social media platforms (YouTube, TikTok and Instagram). Students will use DSLR and Smart Phone cameras to capture motion imagery while adhering to static photography's fundamental principles and elements. Students will create engaging visual content within a marketing context as per the specifications of relevant social media platforms.

PRINCIPLES AND FUNDAMENTALS OF PHOTOGRAPHY

This module will introduce students to various photographic processes since the inception of photography. Students will be able to grasp the vital relationship between lighting and image formation throughout the decades. This module will assist students to Identify a range of photographic imaging equipment, materials, and camera control functions that are essential components for the working environment of a professional photographer.





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
