

PORTFOLIO REQUIREMENTS

Portfolio of Evidence must be submitted on/before 15 February 2023 with completed registration form.

SCOPE OF APPLICATION

In terms of the Admission Policy at STADIO, a portfolio of evidence and a motivational essay is required over and above the normal requirements such as the completed registration contract for certain qualifications, namely the Bachelor of Applied Arts in 3D Animation and/or the Diploma in 3D Animation. The portfolio is used to evaluate whether the applicant has the necessary drive and prerequisite skills to complete the programme successfully.

Applicants must be computer literate and be able to work within the Microsoft Windows environment. They must demonstrate sound drawing skills and a basic comprehension of three dimensional shapes. They must submit a well organised portfolio of 5 individual artworks listed below, and at least 5 additional examples of drawings/paintings they have done within the past year.

HOW SHOULD I SUBMIT MY PORTFOLIO OF EVIDENCE?

- All applicants must submit the required portfolio, irrespective of whether they have done art or design at school, or not.
- Submitting the portfolio does not automatically mean that the application has been approved.
- Applicants should submit only ONE portfolio for entry into the Diploma or Degree qualification.
- Applicants must complete the portfolio without any assistance. Do not copy or trace drawings from other artwork or designs.
- The portfolio should not include any work done on cardboard or canvas, or framed work especially glass or wood-mounted artwork.
- Applicants may include any additional evidence such as photographs of own work, but the portfolio may not consist of
 a series of photographs only.
- All artwork included in the portfolio should be limited to A4 size.
- Good quality copies of artwork (A4 format) are allowed.
- Please do not bind the artwork.
- The name of the applicant and the relevant programme Bachelor of Applied Arts in 3D Animation and/or the Diploma in 3D Animation must appear on the cover page of the portfolio. The name of the applicant must also appear on the flip side of each artwork in the portfolio.
- The portfolio must be mailed (preferably sent via WeTransfer https://wetransfer.com/) to, or delivered by hand at the Marketing office on campus.
- Applicants from distant locations must ensure that the documents are secured in a sturdy folder to prevent damage to the documents inside when submitting the portfolio by mail.
- Only International and students from abroad may submit a digital portfolio using a PDF, which can be emailed to info@stadio.ac.za or sent via WeTransfer https://wetransfer.com/ Please make sure the portfolio size does not exceed 10MB.
- Portfolios will not be returned to students unless collected personally.

INTERVIEW

Interview may be conducted over skype video call, should the Program Coordinator wishes to do so.

WHAT TO INCLUDE IN YOUR PORTFOLIO OF EVIDENCE:

1. DECLARATION

A personal declaration that the items included in the portfolio are your own work.

A signed affidavit from a person of authority (e.g. a school principal) confirming that the work in the portfolio is the applicant's own original work.

2. ESSAY

Write an essay of 1-2 pages (A4 size) in which you:

- explain the reasons why you want to study this particular qualification, with reference to your interest in this articular field of work, what makes you "tick" about this specific field of work.
- · describe your background and experience related to computer art and design.
- describe what you want to get out of the programme.
- · indicate the particular career you aspire after obtaining this qualification.

3. PRACTICAL WORK

Please make use of the following media for your sketches:

- · Pencil, or
- · Black ink ballpoint or fine liners, or
- Charcoal, compressed or stick charcoal allowed

All sketches with the exception of the technical sketch must be shaded. Pencil sketches must be dark for scanning purposes.

Please do not submit your original created art work, instead scan and reprint these artworks up to A4 size.

DRAWING 1: Landscape, Point 1 Perspective (Pick 1 of the following):

- · Your backyard garden.
- · Passageway of some kind.
- Beach with rocky outcrops.

DRAWING 2: Anatomy (Pick 1 of the following):

- · Hand pointing at something, clearly showing the fingers
- · Hand in a fist, showing the fingers
- · Hand holding a tennis ball

DRAWING 3: Still life perspective sketch (Pick 1 of the following):

- Apple, banana and lemon in an arrangement. One sketch must show all three objects.
- Stapler, hole punch and scissors in an arrangement. One sketch must show all three objects.
- · Hammer, spanner and screwdriver in an arrangement. One sketch must show all three objects

DRAWING 4: Character concept, non anime (Pick 1 of the following):

- · Cyborg, part human, part machine, full body in a pose
- · Therianthropic, part human, part animal, full body in a pose
- · Superhero or Supervillain, full body in a pose

DRAWING 5: Technical sketch of a single object, 2 view angles top, front, side & perspective (Pick 1 of the following):

- · Vehicle spark plug or brake pad
- Desk with drawers or a single office chair with wheels
- Garden tool of your choice

OWN CHOICE

Include no more than five examples of artworks if you have art as a subject (or work done at home if you do not study art at school), that show your particular area of interest and creative/artistic skills.

HOW TO ORGANISE AND PRESENT YOUR PORTFOLIO:

The items in the portfolio should be presented in an organised manner as follows

COVER PAGE

- Applicant's name
- Mailing Address
- Contact details (Tel/Cellphone Number, or email address)
- Title of the specific programme you are applying for
- Signed declaration

A panel of academic staff involved in the programme concerned will evaluate the items in your portfolio. The applicant will be informed in writing whether he/she may register as a student at STADIO. Should your application for a particular programme not be approved, you will be advised to consider an alternative option.
